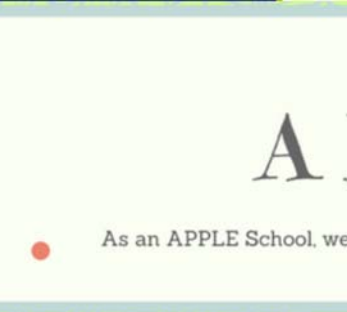
Although their vote did not count for the actual election, students took this as a learning opportunity. Once every four years this event gives students an idea of what the process of voting is like.
